WHERE WILL I STAY AT NIGHT?



WHERE WILL I STAY AT NIGHT?

If you are a Mini Camper, Farm Mini Camper, or an Explorer, you stay overnight in cabins with bunk beds! You can choose the top or the bottom bunk when you arrive. These cabins have bathrooms with a toilet, shower, and sink.

WHERE WILL I STAY AT NIGHT?

If you are a Trailblazer or a Forester, you get to stay in dwellings across the river! You will bring your own sleeping bag and pillow.

Trailblazers stay in brown cabins with cots to sleep on.

Foresters stay in teepees, yurts, and longhouses in a pine forest just past the Trailblazer Village. Each camper gets a padded mat to sleep on.

WHAT ABOUT THE BATHROOMS?



This outhouse looks rustic but has a flush toilet and TP inside. The water spigot is on the left.

Trailblazers and Foresters both have outhouses to use for the bathroom. An outhouse has toilets and works really well in the forest setting. You can wash your hands and brush your teeth at the water spigot nearby, and you can shower when you visit the pool! During the day, you will often be around buildings with a modern bathroom you can use.

WHO WILL BE WITH ME?

Your counselor and cabinmates stay with you in your cabins or forest dwellings and will be there if you need anything!



During the day, you will be around other parts of camp like the pool, the Creation Center and Cedar Lodge, and you will also see other groups of campers and their counselors.

WHO WILL BE MY COUNSELOR?

You will meet your counselor when you check in at camp. Go to our social media (search for “Camp Ewalu”) and you can see many of the counselors before you arrive!



All of Ewalu’s counselors have special training to help campers be safe and to have fun.

WHAT'S FOR DINNER?

Lots of kids say that the food at camp is one of their favorite things! We eat three meals every day. Some meals are served at Cedar Lodge. We also cook some meals outside over a campfire!

ARE THERE SNACKS?

You will get to stop by our "Canteen" every afternoon! You can buy one snack and one drink if you would like. Your parents leave money for you at check-in, so you will be able to get a snack every day if you want to.

WHAT HAPPENS AT CAMPFIRE?

Every night we have a campfire! While the fire is going, we sing songs, watch skits, pray, and learn more about God.

Sometimes all the programs at camp will have one big campfire together. On some days, you will have a campfire with just your program area!

WHAT IF I DON'T KNOW THE SONGS?

It's OK if you don't know the songs or the words. A lot of kids don't remember all the words, even if they learned a song before. The Ewalu counselors are really good about teaching the songs so that everyone can take part.

WHAT THINGS WILL WE DO?

During your time at camp, your activities are all scheduled for you! You will get to do fun things every day like swimming at the pool, creek stomping, gaga ball, hiking, games, Bible study, arts and crafts, and so much more!

Your counselor is trained to know what to do and to keep you safe when plans change. You can trust them to make sure you still have fun, even if your day looks a little different than what is on the schedule.

Please have your parent write your name on each item you bring — then we can call you if you leave something behind! You can also write a list of all the items you are bringing to camp, and then check that list before you head back home.

We don't have WiFi or good cell service outdoors at Ewalu, so your phone won't be of much use anyway. Because no one else is using a device at camp, you won't really miss it —you'll be amazed at how much fun you can have without it! Really!


